

Key knowledge - Who were the Anglo-Saxon warriors?



The Anglo-Saxons were a group of farmer-warriors who invaded and settled in Britain after the Romans left. They were fierce people, who fought many battles during their rule of Britain – often fighting each other! Each tribe was ruled by its own strong warrior who settled their people in different parts of the country.

Key knowledge – Who was King Arthur?



King Arthur was one of the most powerful and famous kings of Britain from the Anglo Saxon times. According to legend Arthur was the leader who defended against the Anglo-Saxons during the invasion. He also pulled the sword Excalibur from the stone.
