Updates for Parents & Carers

Dear Parents and Carers,

I am writing to provide some updates on school and what we are up to at the moment. I am very proud of the children and their behaviour around the school. When I started at Mason Moor in September, as you know, we had an issue with behaviour and attitudes across the school. I am pleased to tell you that this has stopped – our corridors and classrooms are calm, happy environments where children can flourish.

Last Friday, 25 parents attended this month's Parent Forum – an opportunity for Parents and Carers to come in and meet the Headteacher. We took a tour around the school to show off our newly decorated building. Parents had some great ideas – and some issues - that they wanted resolving which I list later in this letter.

In classrooms, I have been so proud to see children really engaged in their learning. I have been especially proud of children's writing and the push we have at the minute on developing a love of being a writer.

Yesterday, during the afternoon, our children had the opportunity to watch the World Cup match between England and Iran during their lessons. An important competition for our country, as well as being an opportunity to embed teaching about cohesion and community.

During the final week of term – every day is a Christmas Jumper day. Over the course of the week – we have lots of festive activities planned including a Christmas story day, Christmas Carol singing and more fun!



Parent forum – you said, we did...

On Friday 18 November, I met with parents and carers – here's some of the feedback we had during the day:

"The children are behaving so beautifully now – it was great to see them in their lesson – they look really proud of their work"

"I love their new exercise books – it was good to see the learning journey at the front of the book"

"The school looks so different. The fresh paint and new doors make a big difference"

Things you would like us to improve:

You said: "The office team aren't communicating well with parents – they don't always pass

on messages and they get things wrong when we speak to them"

We did: We are appointing, this week, an SAO (School Administrative Officer) to lead and manage the office team. The new role will be central in providing more effective

customer service to parents/carers and to help you get your queries answered

efficiently.

In the School Office, all telephone calls are now recorded on a central system – accessed by all leaders at the school so that we are aware of telephone calls coming

in to school and can action any parental concerns.

You said: "Parents and Carers would like to get more involved in school life – to help raise

funds or to support the children in getting new experienced. Do you still have a

friends of Mason Moor group?"

We did: Following the discussion, I met with Ms Fuller who supports in the Main School

Office. A date for a meeting is going out to help grow our very small team. In addition, we would welcome any support from our parent community – perhaps reading with the children or being able to offer a hand in other ways – it all adds to

that sense of community we so desperately want to build.



Special Educational Needs at Mason Moor

Parents have been asking me about the leadership of SEND during the current continued absence of our SENCo. I am currently leading Special Educational Needs – supported by Mr Benfield.

This term we have implemented new strategies to improve the support in class and diagnostic tools we use to understand a child's needs:

- GL Assessment Dyslexia Screener and Dyslexia Guidance. A 40-60 minute diagnostic test which helps us to identify dyslexic tendencies and recommends intervention strategies for teachers to follow.
- Provision Mapper a new software to digitally create and update SEND pupils Passport to Success (the individual education plan we create for supporting wider needs).



If you believe that your child is struggling or may have a need – come and talk to us! Initially, you need to share your concerns directly with your child's class teacher.

The class teacher will complete the referral form (internally) and we will sign-post out to a multiagency professional.

Attendance

Attendance at Mason Moor

Attendance at this school is monitored closely by Southampton City Council. The register marks are collected daily and are seen nationally as well as locally at the Council.

Children who have attendance that falls below 95% will have initial intervention – this will include letters home and meetings with the school.

Attendance that goes below 90% will be fined – this is a last resort for the school but is not something we have any jurisdiction in deciding.
