drawbridge	a movable bridge typically at the entrance to a castle or tower surrounded by a moat
cable car	a carriage on a cable railway to carry you over something
commuter	a person who travels some distance to work on a regular basis
pedestrian	a person walking rather than travelling in a vehicle
House of Commons	one of the two parts of Parliament, whose members are chosen to represent parts of the UK
monarch	a King or Queen
Lord	a person who has authority
MP	a Member of Parliament. Someone who has been voted in to work in the Houses of Parliament.
automated	someone is not controlling it
tram	a type of train
Buckingha m Palace	the London residence of the monarch of the United Kingdom
residence	a person's home, especially a large and impressive one
royal	the status of a king or queen or a member of their family
