Issues with SEND provision at Mason Moor





What is different this year to make it better?

Appointed Mr Benfield as the SENCo – to take over from Ms Patrick. Developed a new in-class provision map software to make sure that children's needs are met

Given the TAs training from external professionals

Are we there yet? NO!

Joined the Autism in School's project with the NHS and CAMHS to make us an ASD friendly school

Brought training in for teachers to ensure that they are better equipped at supporting needs.

Spent £5000 on assistive and supportive technology to improve SEND pupils learning

I know what the minefield of SEN looks like, I've been there...



- Nobody in the immediate family home had stable employment. Family relied on benefits (family credit)
- Brought up on a council estate in Manchester
- Broken home not in a stable relationship
- Parental order brought up by Grandparents
- No immediate role-model who had progressed beyond secondary school
- Statement of need Dyslexia
- Could not read or write until 12 years old
- Went to a special needs school

An outdoor classroom will be installed to enable us to start FOREST SCHOOL

- Self-esteem
- Creativity
- Confidence
- Builds social skills in a neutral environment
- Tactile and multi-sensory development
- Creates independence
- Provides other spaces that the classroom





The new provision of SENSORY circuits for SEND learners to begin their day

- Calming effect for dysregulated children on entry to school.
- Socialisation with peers.
- Improved focus.
- Motor skill development.
- Sensory development touch, feel,





RE: Minds Southampton SEND charity – working with Mason Moor for 1 year.

- Parent group every week: Tuesday 9-12:30 in the Main Hall
- Support with completing forms/applications.
- Chance to meet other parents from across Southampton with children who have additional needs.
- Support networks in your local community





Opening a new SEND Unit – a specialist provision at Mason Moor

- Springwell cannot take anymore children as it is at maximum capacity.
- Children with Autistic spectrum needs require teaching in their own community.
- We will have a specialist SEND teacher who will teach 10 children in a unit.
- 50% of the SEN unit children's day will be in mainstream with peers.
