
and the celebrations that we celebrate around its edges.

### **E-Scooters on School Site**


A reminder that we do not allow e-scooters on site at Mason Moor Primary School. If you arrive on site with one, we will politely ask you to leave these at the gate.

#### Learning at Mason Moor this week:



Reception have immersed themselves in the Nativity story this week. We have been working on retelling and sequencing the story in our writing lessons. In Maths we tackled the really tricky topic of 3D shapes and their properties. We have learnt some new words such as vertices and Surfaces and have worked together to sort the shapes by their properties. We are very proud of the fantastic effort that they have made whilst exploring this tricky topic.



This week in Maple class, we have been looking at time in maths and we have also been looking at fractions in our number sessions! In English, we have been looking at prefixes alongside planning our diary extracts which links to our topic of writing to inform!



This week we have been writing stories about rockets and space! These have been great fun to write and we have really enjoyed adding in our newly learnt features. In geography, we have been learning about the Galapagos Islands and the transport that people use to travel around when they are there!

This was really exciting and we are keen to travel there ourselves!



This week year 2 have been working really hard on their independent write and have worked hard to apply their knowledge from the week into this write. In addition to this year 2 have been looking at the advent wreath and how it links to the Christmas story and then Easter. Some of us didn't make the link between the baby Jesus and the Jesus that we hear in the Easter story.



This week year 3 finished writing their non-chronological reports about China. They were able to utilise their knowledge from their Geography and History units to create a wonderful piece of writing. We have just begun our money unit in mathslooking at different coins and adding them together.

Year 3 did themselves proud this week with their impeccable behaviour whilst visiting the church for a lovely Christingle celebration!



Year 4 have had lots of fun this week! We started the week with VR headsets, looking at the structure of volcanoes and the terrible destruction that occurred at Pompeii in 79AD. That's just our writing! In maths, we have begun to look at fractions - we've looked at equivalent fractions which is very intriguing!

Some of us were lucky enough to go to Communicare, which was a very rewarding morning!



This week, we have wrapped up our swimming - it's been a great three weeks and we have learned so much! In maths, we have been measuring angles using a protractor! This is a great skill and we are becoming increasingly confident! In writing, we have been continuing our newspaper writing journey. We are looking forward to next week's Mason Moor Museum!



Not only has our fantastic swimming journey come to an end but we have been learning so much in class! We have continued reading our novel; have spent time learning more about perimeter and written a newspaper article in writing! We also spent a lot of time considering our Mason Moor Museum projects - we're really excited to share our work next week!




