Learning at Mason Moor:

Nursery

This week in Nursery we have been exploring all things animals. We have read the story Clip Clop and have been retelling the story now we are more familiar with it. In Maths we have been looking at numbers and counting them using a variety of resources. We have been exploring finding 1 more and 1 less. We had a fun craft session with our grown ups thank you for coming to support our learning.

The Ark

This week we have been working on knowing the value of numbers 1-3 and matching basic 2D shapes. We have also been practising turn taking with adult support.

Year R

This week reception have been writing instructions. First, we made rockets and then wrote instructions on how to make them. In Maths we have been diving deep into numbers and our counting fluency whilst in Topic we have been learning about the planet we live on and Saint David's Day. We have also had our first week of outdoor learning which was really fun.

Year 1

This week in year one we have started a new unit on Supertato. We have started to describe the character and we will be writing our own version of the story. In maths we have started looking at capacity, we investigated the capacity of 3 objects. We could then order them from the biggest capacity to the smallest.

Year 2

This week, we have been focusing on improving our reading and retrieval skills, by reading information about the Anglo-Saxons. We took on the challenge of writing a narrative independently, where we wrote the story of The Magic Paintbrush in our own words.

Year 3

In Year 3 this week we have been amazing our teachers with our maths. We have been multiplying and dividing by ten, and now we are focusing on our times tables recall as well. We have started a new history topic in which we have learnt all sorts of gory facts about the Black Death and how people tried to cure it. And in Geography we have started exploring different types of settlements and land uses.

Year 4

In year 4 we have been looking about symmetry in maths this week, thinking about lines of symmetry in shapes and patterns. In writing we have been looking at descriptive language features in the context of our story 'Hello Lighthouse'. In non-core we have been learning how erosion plays a part in creating the features of our coastline.

Year 5

In Year 5 this week have been exploring the purpose of satellites and researching the different things they can measure and record! We have also been designing our satellites so that we can make them next week! In writing we have been exploring a picture from our new book and have been preparing to write character descriptions!

Year 6 have been great this week with their perseverance across all lessons. In writing, we've been planning and beginning to write our persuasive letters to the Brazilian Government to change deforestation which is affecting our planets climate change. The children had such amazing ideas. On Tuesday, a group of children had drinks and cakes with some of Southampton's community - sharing about how they've grown up and asking each other questions. They also wrote down everything they were grateful for in life, some of the children's lists were beautiful! Some girls on Wednesday, got to go and support Mason Moor in a football tournament against St Mary's primary school. Even though we didn't win, they couldn't wait to share their personal wins with me the next day.

This week in Maple class we have been focusing on creating conjunctions to improve our sentence writing. In Phonics and SPAG, we have been continuing to look at segmenting and blending words with digraphs and trigraphs. In SPAG we have looked modal verbs. In this lesson we had to identify the modal verb within a sentence and then we had a go at writing our own sentences. In Maths we have been looking at counting in different ways. We have also looked at arrays and using concrete apparatus to support our understanding of multiplication. In our topic maths we have continued to look at telling the time. We have been practicing telling the time in five-minute intervals. All children in Maple class have worked incredibly hard this week!


Sign of the Week
