<p><b>The Five Pillars of Islam</b></p> <p><b>Shahadah:</b> Muslims say a declaration of faith.</p> <p><b>Salah:</b> Muslims pray five times a day. Before prayer, they must wash themselves and then face Mecca whilst praying.</p> <p><b>Zakat:</b> Muslims must donate to charities.</p> <p><b>Sawm:</b> Muslims fast for one month during a time called Ramadan.</p> <p><b>Hajj:</b> Muslims have to travel to Mecca once in their lifetime, if they can afford to.</p>	<p><b>The Six Main Beliefs</b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Belief in Allah as the one and only God.</li> <li>2. Belief in angels.</li> <li>3. Belief in the holy books.</li> <li>4. Belief in the prophets and that Muhammad was the final prophet.</li> <li>5. Belief in the Day of Judgement (the day when Allah decides if a person goes to heaven or hell).</li> <li>6. Belief in predestination (the belief that Allah has already planned out what will happen).</li> </ol>
