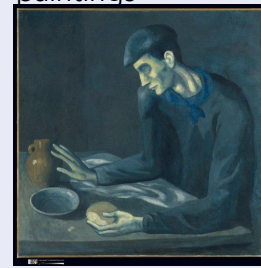
Year 2 Art & Design: Portraits and Self Portraits

| Vocabulary | Meaning |
|-----------------|---|
| portrait | a drawing or painting of someone |
| self portrait | a drawing or painting of yourself |
| detail | an individual part of the portrait |
| material | the things used to create artwork |
| warm colours | colours associated with heat such as red, orange, yellow |
| cool colours | colours associated with cold such as blue, green, purple |
| the blue period | shades of blue and blue-green with other colours used sparingly |
| the rose period | warm, cheerful orange and pink colours |
| collage | pieces cut out and stuck together to make new artwork |
| cubism | a style of art which aims to show all the possible viewpoints of a person or object all at once |
| striking | attracting attention by reason of being unusual, bright or eye catching |
| watercolours | a type of pain used with water |
| sweep | a side to side motion used in painting |
| dab | a pressing motion using in painting |
| background | the parts of an image that are in the back |
| lines | a stroke made with pencil, pen or tool |

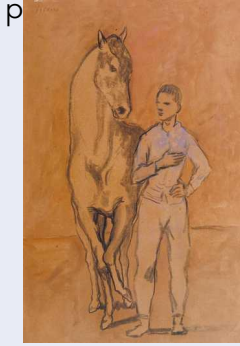
Key knowledge – Famous artists
