Attendance Update




Our **97%** attendance target is still achievable this year if we work together on ensuring children are in school every day and not missing out on learning.

Learning at Mason Moor:

Nursery

This week in Nursery the children have been enjoying reading The Christmas tree with Pip and Posy. We have worked together to bring the Christmas spirit into the nursery by decorating our own tree, creating decorations and starting our Christmas carols. In maths this week the children have recapped 'Less' and 'More' using baubles and miniature Christmas characters.

The Ark

This week in The Ark we have been embedding our skills this half term and getting ready for Christmas! In bucket time, we made our own Christmas wreath and then used our fine motor skills to decorate the trees! In maths, we explored numbers to 10, ready for our next topic of learning. We have exciting Christmas events over the next two weeks and our children are already excited for the festivities!

Year R

This week we have been looking at the book "We're going on an Elf Chase". We have been using our phonic sounds to help us read and write some of the words from the story, we also had a lot of fun trying to find the elves which are hidden in the book. In maths we have been learning about repeated patterns not only with different colours but with different shapes and sizes. We have been creating patterns for our friends to try and continue. In our topic we have been learning songs for our nativity performance and understanding what happens during the nativity and why it is an important time to celebrate.

Year :

In Year 1 we have been looking at doubling and halving in Maths, closely matching them to real life analogies like 'Buy one get one free' and 'sharing equally with a friend'. These two are often easily mixed up so take any opportunity to differentiate them in real life examples! Would you like double the squash in your drink? Two spoons instead of one? Would you like half as many carrots? etc.

Many of them are continuing work on their literacy and building a strong reliance on forming words with sounds they know. Applaud their attempts when they are plausible (spelling correct or not).

Year 2

In Year 2, we have been learning about the lifecycle of a ladybird. The children were keen to know about the different stages to complete a life cycle, and have learnt a new word 'metamorphosis'.

In maths, we have been learning about the properties of 3-D shapes. We investigated different shapes to find out how many faces, vertices and edges each shape has. In addition, we have looked at how many 2-D shapes make up a 3-D shape. For example, we learnt that a cube consists of 6 squares each making a face.

Year 3

This week, Year 3 have been reading the book 'The Great Race', which is a mythological book about how the Chinese years were named. We found out that members of the class were either born in the year of the monkey or the year of the rooster. In writing we then looked at the animals of the Chinese zodiac and how they were described in our book.

Our learning in Maths has been about fractions - and as part of this we enjoyed dividing some chocolate into equal parts!

Year 5

How many ways can Miss Jablonska split her cake? Maths this week has been all about fractions. We've explored different quantities and equivalents, but the biggest slice always seems to go to our teacher. Geography saw us discover more about the taiga and we made some lovely presentations about what it might be like to live there. (Very, very, VERY cold it turns out). Those of us with incredible attendance were even treated to a magic show! This week in year 5, we have been writing letters to loved ones in the perspective of the protagonist from 'The Arrival'. Everyone worked really hard on this and I am very proud of each of you. We have also been very busy making Christmas tree decorations and some decorations for our classroom. They look beautiful and show just how talented each of you are. Well done year 5!

Year 6

Year 6 has had a very busy week. Year 6 have been learning about William Shakespeare's Macbeth, we have used a script and performed Macbeth in the hall and on the stage. The children have enjoyed exploring drama through Macbeth and did an outstanding job performing on the stage. We are now writing a newspaper article using the story of Macbeth. In history this week we have looked at education in Victorian Britain and compared it to how school is in 2024, we all agreed school is much better in 2024 than in 1880. Keep up this fantastic work year 6!

Pathways

This week in Pathways we have been exploring how to measure in maths. We have measured Chocolate bars, animals and pictures using Centimetres. We have also started decorating our classroom to spread Christmas cheer. We have made buntings and Christmas tree decorations.

The children have also started to enjoy fire based activities in the outdoor classroom.

Nurture

In nurture we have been helping Mrs Claus in the decoration dash when we have finished our class learning. We have made gingerbread houses, Christmas trees, snowflakes and wreaths. We text Santa Claus too to make sure we were all on the good list. Also we really enjoyed our Writing this week where we had our faces painted so we could imagine how the animals in the story "The great race" imagined how it would feel to be the dragon, the tiger and the cat.


Here we have a Pathways pupil creating a Christmas bunting for the classroom to start spreading the Christmas cheer.





The Ark have been practicing their numbers to 10 and learning how to order numbers in different ways.



Working together in nurture to make a very fiddly wreath for Mrs Claus, and then getting into character for our writing.







