


Knowledge Organiser: SPRING 1 Year 3 Art & Design: Elements of Art: Line, Symmetry and Form

Vocabulary	Meaning
Hatching	An artistic technique used to create effects by drawing closely spaced parallel lines
Swirl	Move in a twisting spiraling pattern
Spiral	A continuous and gradually widening (or tightening) curve
Circular	Having the form of a circle
Contour	Defines the outline of a form without the use of shading
Form	The visible shape or configuration of something
Realism	Accurate and true to life
Crosshatching	Intersecting sets of parallel lines
Structure	Building or other object constructed from several parts
Geometric	Charaterised by or decorated with regular lines and shapes
Two dimensional	Having or appearing to have length and breadth by no depth
Three dimensional	Having or appearing to have length, breadth and depth
Assemble	Fir together the separate parts
Dome	Rounded vault forming the roof
Curving	forming a curve
Balance	How the elements of art relate to each other to create an art work that is pleasing to the eyes

Key knowledge - Symmetry & Asymmetry

Symmetry - A type of balance where the two halves of artwork mirror each other

Asymmetry – A type of balance where the two halves are not the same but appear to have an equal visual weight



Key knowledge - Famous artists

Victor Vasarely was a famous artist known for his "op" (optical) art. The artists use shapes, colours and patterns in special ways to create images that look as if they are moving or blurring.
